Magna Recycling Spotlight

The largest contaminant in the District is plastic packaging. Items such as bubble wrap, Styrofoam, padded envelopes and plastic wrap are not recyclable in our curbside bins. One way we can look to improve recycling in the District is by reducing the amount of flimsy plastic that is placed in our curbside recycling bins. Remember, if it is plastic and you can ball it up in your fist, it is garbage!

What is recycling contamination? Every day we collect your recyclables and drop them off at a sorting facility here locally. However, nearly 25% of the material in the blue recycling bins we collect are trash. Trash in our curbside bins like garbage bags, packaging plastics, wire and food are recycling contamination!

Recycling contamination affects the recycling process in multiple ways. One way contamination negatively affects the process is when these contaminants jam the sorting machines, causing a huge delay. Recycling contamination also happens when trash ruins good recyclables during the sorting process. For example, food or liquid that ends up in the sorting process will contaminate otherwise clean materials, causing them to no longer be recyclable making them trash.
